

# Categories of Membership



## REGULAR MEMBERSHIP

Regular members are defined as those who, having met the qualifications and having been elected by the Membership Committee, are entitled to all rights and privileges of the Club; to normal use of its facilities, including its stations and waterfront facilities; to vote in Club elections; and to hold office.

## SOCIAL MEMEBRSHIP

A Social Member shall not be entitled to vote, hold office, chair a committee, fly the Club burgee, or have the use of any of the waterfront facilities. Persons owning, leasing, borrowing or otherwise controlling a vessel shall not be eligible for Social Membership
